Did you know?
Ngati Kuia is the only surviving Iwi to originate from Te Waipounamu (the South Island). We as an Iwi came into being here. Our whakapapa comes from tupuna turanga from many older Iwi; Ngati Tumatakokiri, Ngai Tara, Ngati Mamoe and later tupuna of Rangitane and Ngati Apa.

Tupuna tūranga (significant tupuna)

Matua Hautere was a descendent of Kupe. He was one of our first tupuna to settle permanently here.

He came here in his waka Te Hoi (h) ere. He named the district settled in after his waka. Te Hoi (h) ere is now the name for the Pelorus district, including the river, sound and one of the names for Maud Island.

Matua Hautere was guided by two taniwha in the forms of dolphins; they were Kaikai-a-warō and Ruamano. Kaikai-a-warō remained here and is one of our Kaitiaki (guardians). The following pepeha (boast) represents this history;

Ko Matua Hautere Te tangata
Ko Kaikai-a-warō Te taniwha
Ko Te Hoiere Te waka
Ko Ngati Kuia Te iwi

Matua Hautere is the person
Kaikai-a-warō is the guardian
Te Hoiere is the Canoe
Ngati Kuia are their people

Whakapapa

The following Kawharu taki (recital) is a Tahu (principle whakapapa line) which illustrates the whakapapa between Kaikai-a-warō to Matua Hautere to Kuia.

Ko Kaikai-a-warō ka mōe i a Ruamano
| ka puta ki waho
Ko Matua Hautere ka mōe i a Kauhōe
| ka puta ki waho

Ko Tukauae ka mōe i a Hinerewha
| ka puta ki waho
Ko Kuia ka mōe i a Rongotamea

Waiata Mai

This waiata tangi (lament) was composed by Taiteariki for his brother Pakauwera who was killed at the battle of Hikapu in 1828 circa. We still learn this waiata at our wananga and sing it at tangi and powhiri.
